# PURPOSE OF AB86

## AB 86 provides

- planning and implementation funds to regional consortia
- to improve the delivery of adult education and to address existing gaps in programs and services.

# MYTH VS. FACT

Myth: Community Colleges will be taking over adult education and adult schools will be closed.

Fact: AB 86 is about collaboration between the Community Colleges and Adult Schools.

# QUICK FACTS

- Consortium shall consist of:
  - School district – *required*
  - Community college district – *required*
- Consortia may include other adult education providers
- Consortium determines fiscal agent
- Non-Competitive Grant

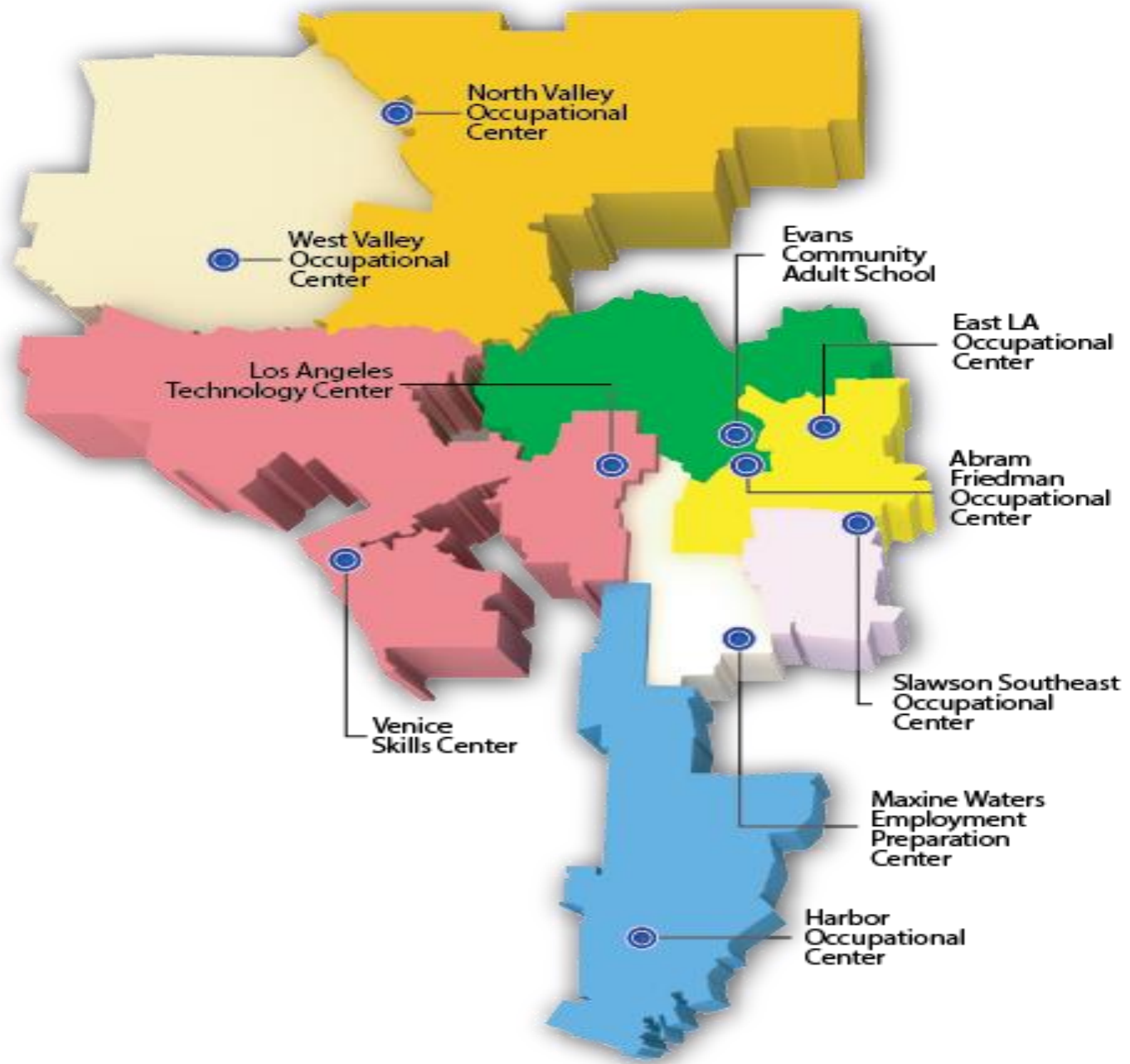
# DEFINITIONS

**Region:** The geographical boundaries of a community college district

**Member:** A public school district or community college district within the geographical boundaries of the designated region

**Partner:** Determined by the local consortium's membership, for example: WIB's, EDD, CA Dept. of Rehab, etc.


# PROGRAM AREAS

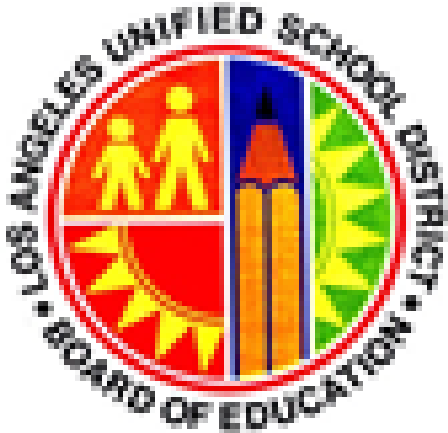
