In 1984, after being recommended adult education by a colleague, he began his teaching career as the Auto Mechanic Instructor at AFOC. He taught in the classroom for six years and later transitioned to DACE Central Office as a Program Advisor. He made the leap to become Assistant Principal of Operations in 1994 at ELAOC. His administrative leadership has carried him to various schools within DACE throughout the last 26 years, including Manual Arts/Jefferson, N. Hollywood-Poly CAS, Van Nuys, Belmont, AFOC, and coming full circle at ELAOC since 2016. Mr. Avila is grateful for his 41 years of service and relationships in adult education programs. What he has enjoyed most about his career in education is that "it's a people business." He has always told students, "The greatest and cheapest investment in your life is in yourself." He believes that "the current adult education workforce stands on the shoulders of many people before us. Their work kept adult education alive for us to continue the legacy." Mr. Avila has never been hesitant to speak his mind, and will be remembered for his humor, wit, and adages, including the following:

STUDENT DEVICE DISTRIBUTION

ELAOC has a limited amount of laptop loaners for students that critically need one to participate in online classes. The following are prerequisites for laptop eligibility:



- Student must be currently registered in an ELAOC class section/s
- Student must be in present contact with an instructor by phone/text/email
- Student must have Wi-Fi or internet access to be able to participate
- Student must meet criteria need for laptop loan set by the school

Selections are made on a first-come, first-served basis. Students will be contacted by an ELAOC Administrator/Advisor with specific instructions for pick-up time and day. Please contact your supervising administrator for requesting instructions.

HOMEBOY WINS HUMANITARIAN PRIZE

Homeboy Industries has won the 2020 Conrad Hilton Humanitarian Prize. The honor, which comes with a \$2.5 million prize, is given to nonprofits that have made "extraordinary contributions" toward alleviating human suffering. Founded in 1988, by Father Gregory Boyle, Homeboy Industries was formed with the goal of improving the lives of former gang members in East Los Angeles. Today, it is the world's largest gang intervention, rehab, and re-entry program. ELAOC is a proud community partner that collaborates with Homeboy Industries to reduce recidivism and enhance job opportunities through our Photovoltaic (PV) program at the ELASC Campus. Each year, numerous Homeboy and Homegirl participants receive PV training with all the educational expenses paid by Homeboy Industries. The partnership produces many graduates that are especially sought-after in the solar panel marketplace. ELAOC commends its valued partner on its commitment and most recent distinguished award.
