- Understand the importance of developing thinking skills in learners and the transfer of learning to other situations.
- Actively engage learners in lessons.

Family Success Initiative

The Division of Adult and Career Education has plans for 2019-2020 to enhance the quality of our Family Success Initiative (FSI) classes. Classes are offered in elementary and middle schools across LAUSD. They are designed for parents of K-12 students and focus on English language learning in the context of parent education and family literacy. FSI invites students to provide input on learning modules and k-12 principals to provide input on how to connect with and support the local school community. It aligns with school events, communication with school staff, and student grades.

An FSI community of practice (CoP) will meet regularly this year to share best practices. The FSI program has the following learning modules, with correlating EI Civics Components: Digital Literacy, Family Health and Wellness, Successful Learners, Employability Skills and US Workplace Culture, LA Public Library, and the 2020 US Census. Two additional modules are in development: Financial Literacy, and Immigrant Rights.
